The USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame, established in 1976, possess the expertise, history and resources necessary to be empowered by Alliance and martial art affiliate organizations to investigate and publicly acknowledge or denounce alleged noteworthy achievements of Martial Art Masters. Whereby, said public acknowledgement when made it is not based upon meeting "A typical" Hall of Fame criteria of the Martial Art Master's attainment of public notoriety or high rank but rather may only be attained through their nomination and vote by way of the Alliance membership with regards to the nominees verifiable contributions to the field of study, practice and in service to others in the martial art community.

Consequently, in light of the mission and spirit of the USA Martial Art Hall of Fame and Alliance commitment to the preservation of historical fact the USA Martial Art Hall of Fame and Alliance can and does hereby fully and definitively **ACKNOWLEDGE, SANCTION AND VERIFY THE WORLD RECORDS AND CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES AS ESTABLISHED BY MR. FRANK W. DUX.** An achievement for which the 1988 motion picture *Bloodsport* is based upon his winning the legendary Kumite predecessor to Mixed Martial Art events and for which Mr. Frank W. Dux was nominated and inducted into USA Hall of Fame as a "*LIVING LEGEND*" on May 10th, 2008.

In doing so, the USA Martial Art Hall of Fame and Alliance does hereby officially recognize and acknowledge as in keeping with the spirit of Kano Jigaro, Mr. Frank W. Dux Martial Art lineage under his instructor Jack Seki, USA Jujitsu Champion 1966-1973, Mr. Frank W. Dux is a Grandmaster/Soke/Hanshi/Founder of his own original martial art systems, entitled: Dux FASST, Dux Ryu, Dux Ryu Ninjitsu, with his source contribution identified in the US Navy SEAL SpecWar CFC manual (k431-0097).

To this end, USA Martial Art Hall of Fame and Alliance does hereby endorse, promote and support **THE FRANK DUX FELLOWSHIP AWARD** established in Mexico City, 2003. This endorsement is based upon Mr. Frank W. Dux globally observable imprint in the martial art community of inspiring others to greatness given his observable community service, professionalism and verified martial art world record achievements and championship titles (as is verified by USA Martial Art Hall of Fame, Alliance, Black Dragon Fighting Society, Imperial, etc. trade magazines, i.e. Black Belt, Katana, Bushido and Artes Marciales magazine, etc.), as follows:

1990 - Chi Kung Tug of War (Standing on one leg) - 66 people, Zug, Switzerland.


1993 - First and only martial artist to break bullet proof glass barehanded - International Martial Arts Festival, Bercy Stadium, Paris, France.

1993 - Multiple Champaign Bottle break at varying heights with a single kick. - International Martial Arts Festival, Bercy Stadium, Paris, France.


1993 - Chi Kung Tug of War (kneeling position) - 23 people. Lausanne, Switzerland
